

Keep my heart from being anxious for what I don't have, and make me thankful for the numerous gifts that You have already given me. According to Your Word and steadfast love, fill me with the joy and satisfaction of contentment in Christ. Help me learn to be content in any situation like Paul and to quickly reject the idolatry that dwells beneath the surface of my coveting.

Finally, may I be learn from and spend my days following the ultimate example of contentment - of Christ who became poor in order that I could become rich, and who was content to go to the cross to fulfill the Father's will to rescue a people for Himself so I can be free from discontent and zealous for good works. GRATITUDE IS GOOD FOR US

STATISTICS show an attitude of gratitude can pave the way for better health, deeper relationships, and increased productivity. One study showed that a five-minute a day gratitude journal can increase your long-term well-being by more than 10 percent. *Psalm 116:17 (NIV)* says, "I will sacrifice a thank offering to you and call on the name of the Lord." In this passage the writer is responding to all that God has done. In his response, he doesn't know how to repay God for what God, in His goodness, has done for him. His response is genuine, a thank offering is what he has to offer God.

Have you ever stopped to think of your prayers fueled by gratitude as a thank offering? Sure, we can give our tithe to the church, financially give to the needs of those around us, and serve with the talents and gifts we've been given, but a "thank offering" is a sweet sound to our Savior and costs us nothing but time. When we purpose in our hearts to live thankfully and cultivate gratitude in our lives, it is a worthy response to the faithfulness of our loving Father.

REFLECT: Here is Colossians 2:6-7 today's verse from the New International Version of the Bible. "So then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live in him, rooted and built up in him, strengthened in the faith as you were taught, and overflowing with thankfulness."

Take a minute and meditate on this verse. Overflowing means full to the top and spilling over. How can we live full to the top and spilling over with gratitude? By expressing to God what we are thankful for and the people around us we are thankful for. What does a sacrifice of thanks look like for you?

RESPOND: Grab your journal, notebook or piece of paper from yesterday, and begin to add to the list. Write out five things you are grateful for. Try not to write the obvious ones like your favorite people or things. Then, take a moment to offer a sacrifice of thanks to God for your list.

TODAY'S PRAYER

Lord, I am truly thankful for all You have done and continue to do for me. The free gift of life You have given me did not come easy, and, in response, I want to offer a sacrifice of thanks to You. I've made a list of some of the things that I am thankful for. I thank You and praise You for ______ (read each one aloud). Accept my sacrifice of thanks today, and help me to continue to grow in ways that I can offer a sacrifice of thanks to You. Give me a heart that is genuinely grateful and thankful for all You have given me. Help me to see even the smallest things in my life as opportunities to say thank You to You and may my sacrifice of thanks become contagious to everyone around me. In Jesus' name, Amen.
